If the Wednesday before Thanksgiving is the busiest in Australia. It is a sure sign that for Australians Easter is a favourite holiday time. And around the country everyone has their favourite Easter pastimes – shows, festivals, sport, family gatherings and picnics. The Easter break was originally prompted by the celebration of the Christian feast of the Three Sacred Days culminating in the celebration of our Lord's rising from the dead. Society has largely forgotten these origins. But for the followers of Christ in 2010, the Easter break challenges them to plot a course taking in both the holy days and the holidays.

Passion Sunday: Christians set out today on the final leg of the journey to Easter, and they start by remembering Jesus' acclaimed entry into Jerusalem. They note the irony of it. He who preached a kingdom of God in mercy and justice is about to be struck down. In understanding the openness of Jesus' life, they better understand what brought him his death.

In his life Jesus was open to every person, not least the outsiders and the poor. So dear to them did he become, he was considered one of them, "He eats and drinks with sinners". Jesus' openness to each person was the trigger for the enemies of openness to close him down. They killed him.

Holy Thursday: Today Christians contemplate betrayal. Usually, it is only those people we love and trust who can betray us, and so it was with Jesus. Betraval most often breaks a person open-either inviting them to deeper compassion or driving them into rigid paranoia. Jesus faced his betrayal and betrayer with the same openness with which he approached every person, every setting. "No one takes my life from me, I lay it down of my own free will".

Good Friday: Openness to others finally caught up with Jesus. Abandoned by his friends and seemingly by his God, he had to dig deep. He did, and he found a more radical openness in a new and shocking moment. From his frightful isolation he cried out. "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do". And later, "Father into your hands I commend my spirit".

The Great Easter Vigil: Holy Saturday is born in the cold stillness of the closed tomb. Jesus is dead. buried. Christians are left wondering whether openness, both human and divine, prished with him. It then dawns on them that waiting cannot be buried for it is the stuff of life. And so, as the sun goes down they gather again – a fragile church waiting in a darkened edifice, entombed but hopeful. As happened with the disciples in the upper room, Jesus comes as the light of truth. He has conquered death and is now among them as the risen Christ. Still he is open to them, still too, open to God, but gloriously so. It is a time for lights, bells, music, song, baptisms and Eucharist. Easter Sunday: Today, Christians having gone down into the grave with Jesus now rise with him into a new life of complete openness.


