TRUTH IN CHARITY

Luke's gospel has Jesus often sitting at meals with respectable people and people socially ostracized because their lives were judged scandalous. He enjoyed the company of all kinds of people, while they in turn were drawn to Him. Many social pariahs in his presence were deeply moved.

Today's gospel has Jesus as the guest of Simon, the Pharisee. But a woman with a scandalous reputation gate-crashed the party. She astonished all present with the public display of her love for Jesus: she washed his feet with her tears, and dried them with her hair. She showered his feet with kisses, and anointed them with special perfume. This extravagance deeply embarrassed the respectable guests and their host. Only Jesus was calmly impressed with what she did. Simon privately questioned not only Jesus' judgment in allowing her to touch him, but also doubted if he was truly a man of God. If he were, Jesus would have known her for a sinner, and wouldn't have let her contaminate him with her touch.

Ironically this woman exposed Simon's own relationship to Jesus. To the Pharisee, this woman was merely a scandalous sinner to be judged and ostracized for fear of becoming defiled himself.

But this woman also laid bare the heart of God. For Jesus, it was true that she had led a scandalous life. But He also saw that she was capable of a lot more than that. By acknowledging her guilt, she allowed divine love and forgiveness to touch her. She was regarded, and of harsh judgment others would pass on her. But she was also supremely confident Jesus would accept her totally, warts and all. In Jesus, we see in action the beautiful pastoral compassion of God in flesh and blood.

Even more shocking to Simon is the implication that Jesus judged the woman to be in a much higher standing compared with himself. Simon may have plenty of religion and a sincere concern to fulfill religious duties as he understood them. But he is locked up in himself and his heart is hard. By contrast, though she was guilty of many sins, she was aware of God's merciful forgiveness – and expressed her gratitude in great gestures of love.

Our gospel story also puts us all on trial. Just as the attitude of the sinful woman exposed Simon for what he was, we too will be exposed. Do we use the truth of others' failures to shut them out, and to put ourselves in a better light? Do we maliciously contribute to their humiliation? Or, do we take the unpleasant truths about others in our stride, with Christian love and compassion – in the belief that they are more than their failures because God loves them and offers forgiveness, and will never abandon them? We all need to be humble. We all need God's mercy. Who knows? Those who receive our condemnation and contempt may in truth be in a much better standing before God than we are.

THOUGHTS ON THE GOSPEL

The woman who came in and approached Jesus, we must presume, had been led by his teaching – and no doubt by his notorious concern for the outcasts of respectable society – to repent of her past life, and she came in to express her gratitude. Those at the meal would be reclining on mats, with their feet drawn behind them, around a low table. Luke tells us, therefore, that she was 'behind him' as she made her remarkable gesture of devotion and gratitude to the Saviour. Jesus begins by reading the thoughts of his host – who, as a Pharisee, is shocked to see Jesus allow himself to be touched by this woman of the streets, and concludes that he cannot possibly be a "prophet".

Jesus' explanation, that is was only right that one who has found God's forgiveness through his ministry should be filled with a grateful love, is an invitation to us all to join him in the midst of the sinners and outcasts he has welcomed into his company. With the words that only the Lord can pronounce, he tells the woman, "Your sins are forgiven."
