## The Joy of Birthdays

As soon as children are old enough to remember, their birthdays become one of the great highlights of the year. They quickly learn that this is a day when they become the centre of attention and can expect presents and parties, surprises and treats. Then as we go through life certain birthdays take on special significance and are celebrated either as rites of passage or landmarks in the unfolding story of our lives. When Luke tells the story of the birth of John the Baptist, he describes the interest and excitement not only of his elderly parents but also of their relatives and neighbours as well. The circumstances of the child's conception and birth had obviously been the subject of much speculation and gossip because Elizabeth had conceived unexpectedly in her old age and her husband, Zechariah, had been struck dumb in the midst of his confusion over the whole affair.

Eight days after his birth and as his parents fulfil the Jewish rite of circumcision his name becomes the subject of some contention. However, not only does Zechariah confirm his wife's unexpected choice, but also it proves to be the catalyst for him to recover his power of speech, leading everyone else to ask: "Who will this child turn out to be?"

The Church's calendar does not include many birthdays: in fact we celebrated only three: the births of Mary, John and Jesus. And only the births of John and Jesus are actually mentioned in the Scriptures. In fact, as Luke describes their births in the first couple of chapters of his Gospel, we can see a number of similarities in the way the stories unfold; among them the words he uses only for Mary after the birth of Jesus, but for everyone after the birth of John: "All who heard it treasured it in their hearts." There is no doubt that he wants us to treasure his words too. John the Baptist assumes huge importance in the Gospel story because he links the Old and New Testaments and fulfils the great role of all the prophets, pointing us in the direction of God and of his Son, Jesus of Nazareth. Whenever a child is born in our family or our parish we instinctively ask the question: "Who will this child turn out to be?" By the same token we can assume that the same question was asked of us when we were born. As we look back on our lives, if we can say that we have tried in some way at least to point others in the direction of God, then we can rejoice that we have begun to fulfil our prophetic role in the life of the Christian community. At our baptism we were named and anointed to be servants of God, prophets in our own time and place. May the Lord strengthen us to fulfil this role ever more faithfully. So, thank God for your birthday and many happy returns.

### **FEASTS**

#### **Thursday 28 June – St Irenaeus**

St Irenaeus was one of the most important Early Church Fathers of the 2nd century AD. His life reveals the cosmopolitan nature of the Roman Empire at the height of its power. St Irenaeus was bishop of Lyons, in Southern France, though he appears to have grown up in Smyrna, in modern-day Turkey. There, Irenaeus had personal contact with St Polycarp, one of the Apostolic fathers who in turn knew the Apostle John, son of Zebedee.

#### **Friday 29 June – Ss Peter & Paul Apostles**

The Feast Day of St Peter and Paul is a timely reminder of the pivotal roles each played in setting the foundations of the Church. Yet they represent two strikingly different approaches to discipleship. Peter had to learn slowly, make many mistakes along the way and be reliant on the mercy and encouragement of Jesus. In contrast, Paul came to the faith immediately and never backed away from his zeal to proclaim Christ to the world.

## A Space for The Year of Grace



### Grace in the Bible: The Gospels

Every time we say the 'Hail Mary', we begin: "Hail Mary full of Grace, the Lord is with you!" These words refer to the greeting made by the Angel Gabriel to Mary as it is written in the Gospel of St. Luke. Mary is the one so highly favoured by the Lord. She first asked what was that all about, and after the angel's explanation, Mary accepted God's favour (Grace) with joy. "I am the handmaid of the Lord," she said, "let what you have said be done to me". (Luke 1:38). Mary was praised by Elizabeth who said: "Blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled". (Lk 1:45) Then Mary praised God with the canticle of the Magnificat: "... the Almighty has done great things for me..." In the visitation of Mary to Elizabeth we recognise the expected birth of John the Baptist and that of Jesus. This weekend we celebrate the feast of St. John the Baptist's birth. The name John (from Johanan) means: Yahweh's (God's) gracious gift. Another significant name that means "Grace" is the name Anne or Hannah, the mother of Mary. God's actions are surrounded by "Grace", the great favour given to Mary and to humanity in Jesus Christ: "The Word made flesh" as it is written in the Gospel of St. John chapter 1 verse 14: "The Word was made flesh, he lived among us, and we saw his glory, the glory that is his as the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth ... Indeed, from his fullness we have, all of us received – yes, grace in return for grace". The truth and reality of Jesus Christ as our saviour is manifested on the cross accompanied by his Mother Mary who was at the foot of the Cross and called to be the Mother of the disciple who represented all disciples. John's gospel tells us that Jesus said: "It is accomplished" and gave up his spirit. That spirit gave birth to the church symbolically expressed in that new relation of mother and disciple. Mary "full of grace" remains the mother of the church and mother of us all a model of faith and a sign of hope. In this Year of Grace may we like Mary accept and believe in the grace that God gave us through Jesus Christ.
