Paradox of the Cross

In today's world, changes are a fact of life. We all know this from experience. We adapt to new technologies. We sign up for fitness programs, hoping they'll improve the way we look. We take on new jobs and careers, relocate to the coast, adopt the latest fad, and move house with comparative ease. Superficial changes sit fairly easily with us. The deeper ones, such as changing our outlook on something, are harder to come by.

Today's readings challenge us to do just that. Zechariah and Luke remind us that the Chosen One must suffer, and that cross-bearing is the lot of all who would follow Him. Both startling insights, if we stoop to think about them.

All of us have come up against an imperfect world, and we all carry wounds. We can't airbrush our lives, much as we'd sometimes like to. Failure, hardship and pain are part of the package. We've seen ads that portray a "perfect" existence, but we take them with more than a grain of salt. Our vulnerability is a fact of life. When Jesus encourages us to take up his cross, he's really challenging us to take a fresh look at this shadow side of ourselves.

This will be quite new for many of us. But if we can learn to look within, at the places in our hearts where we are most vulnerable, we'll find that they will lead us to God. For God touches us in our weakness. This is the paradox of the cross. If we can accept this, we begin to live more fruitfully. Our wounds won't go away, they are our 'way of the cross', but they can become our gateway to God. We pick up our cross and start to carry it only when we realise the truth of this. Falling down and getting up again will always be part of our journey. But when our frailty seems too much to bear, that is when we know how much we need God's Loving Divine Presence.

For us, as for Mary Mackillop, there will be no miraculous deliverance from the struggles of life. She took the title 'Mary of the Cross' in recognition of this. Mary was no stranger to negative feelings, uncertainty, doubts and helplessness. But she could write "My name in religion is Mary of the Cross. No name could be dearer to me". She understood that if we live our humanity truly and fully we can expect to be wounded. Love always involves suffering.

When we grasp the idea that carrying our cross is healing for us, our outlook gradually begins to change. We discover that the Mystery of God comes to us disguised in difficult situations and people. We need not fully understand our suffering; however, in time, its value in our lives will become clearer. This is what Jesus meant when he said that 'those who lose their life for my sake will save it'.

THOUGHTS ON THE GOSPEL

Who do you say I am? Is a very challenging question. Beyond names and family ties, it concerns the commitments and loyalties that shape a person's identity as their life unfolds. It is challenging, because it invites the one addressed to measure themselves against these commitments. What follows in the gospel narrative makes it clear that this is what Jesus intends as he asks his question of his first followers. And he asks the same question of those in every generation. Jesus invites his disciples to identify with his mission for the life of the world, fully aware of all that this mission involves.

The words of Jesus are addressed to us. Living in a world disfigured by destructive forces that seem impossible to overcome, we are called to give ourselves 'every day', in the concrete circumstances of our lives, to all that Jesus stands for, knowing that it is his life-giving 'cross' that we are taking up with him. And, as we live in unshakeable hope in the Saviour's final victory over all evil, we will come to know the joy implied in his words, 'anyone who loses his life for my sake will save it'.
