Travel light

The extraordinary progress in communications has reduced the world to what is often described today as a “global village”. We can directly communicate with one another in a variety of ways, even if we are at the opposite ends of the earth. If we so choose, we can travel any distance that separates us, and be in one another’s company in a comparatively short space of time. Many frequent travelers learn to travel light. Indeed some airlines offer big incentives to those who can pack all their belongings into a compact case. Nevertheless, there remain those who weigh down the plane with huge suitcases, terrified that the one article they choose to leave behind will prove to be the one they will need.

For all that, it is likely that even today’s “light traveler” will be bemused by Jesus’ instructions to his disciples when he sends them on their first missionary expedition: “Carry no purse, no haversack no sandals.” The idea that we travel without the security of funds and the wherewithal to supply our basic human needs many strike us as foolhardy and even presumptuous. And while we may readily accept that the circumstances in which the disciples were venturing forth were wholly different from those that confront the modern traveler, we may still find it difficult to bridge the gap and understand the lesson Jesus is teaching.

In the Old Testament there are stories of prophets modeling their message by their actions. An example of this is the prophet Ezekiel, who describes how the Lord ordered him to act out the departure of an exile from the city of Jerusalem as a warning that this was what would befall the people. In today’s Gospel similarly Jesus wants the disciples to demonstrate by their actions a way of life that helps people to get their priorities right. It is very easy in today’s consumer world to convince ourselves that almost everything is necessary, something that we simply cannot do without. Yet experienced travelers realise that much of what they once packed they never actually used, and so they learn to travel light. Probably the most powerful example of all this is when tragedy strikes in the form of some natural disaster and people simply lose all

their possessions. It is amazing how resilient the human spirit is in such situations. We see how people and those who come to their aid become amazingly resourceful and discover what really is necessary.

The disciples returned from their venture, delighted with how well things had gone. Jesus again has to help them get the perspective right. It was not human success that mattered, but rather that their names were written in heaven. The challenge for us is to check our baggage and see whether anything is weighing us down and preventing us from experiencing the freedom that comes to the disciples of Jesus.
