Listen Up

A shipping company advertised for a wireless operator. A batch of eager applicants gathered in a room waiting to be interviewed. There was a buzz of nervous conversation but not one of them heard the dots and dashes coming over the intercom.

A young man arrived. He sat quietly in a corner of the room. Suddenly he stood up and walked into the manager's office. He emerged a few minutes later and announced that he had the job. The others were peeved. They were there first. Why was he privileged and they not? He announced, "If you had listened to the message on the intercom, you could have been first and got the job. It said in Morse code: 'The man I need must be alert. The first one to respond to this message and come directly to my office will be offered employment." This story helps illuminate the message of today's Gospel story. Two sisters, Mary and Martha, receive Jesus as their guest but only Mary receives him as he wishes to be received. Mary "sits at his feet" and listens to what he has to say. This is the traditional posture of a disciple. First and foremost, a true disciple is one whose whole attention is focused on the Master. Oliver Wendell Holmes put it neatly when he wrote, "It is the province of knowledge to speak and the privilege of wisdom to listen." Jesus reveals the knowledge of God. The wise disciple's first duty is to listen.

By sitting at the Lord's feet, Mary took a risk. She assumed a role assigned to men. At that time, women were assigned to domestic duties. Society expected Mary to be in the kitchen helping her sister Martha. Martha performs the role society expects of her, but it is not the role of the true disciple. Her primary task is to listen to Jesus. She has allowed secondary matter to distract her.

We find it hard to accept that the primary task of a disciple is to listen to our Master. Secretly we admire Mary but feel more comfortable with Martha. One wit remarked "I respect Mary but I would marry Martha!" In Luke's Gospel, this story follows the story of the Good Samaritan who displayed such admirable love for his neighbour. It is almost as if St. Luke deems it necessary to remind his readers that, while love of neighbour is necessary, it is even more important to love God and to pay careful attention to God's word. Quite rightly our society esteems those who care for their fellows. They deserve our admiration. However, it is even more necessary for the true disciple of Christ to listen deeply to the word of God and then to put it into practice.

The Church exhorts all its members to pay close attention to the sacred scriptures — not only at our Sunday Eucharist but also by meditating on the scriptures during the week. Listening to God's word and obeying it takes precedence even over our duty to do good needs for our neighbour. In fact, the more we are open to God, the more room we have in our hearts to love others.

THOUGHTS ON THE GOSPEL

We find an example of hospitality in today's Gospel story. Since Martha welcomed Jesus, she was probably the householder, responsible for showing hospitality-which she did. Mary, on the other hand, entertained the guest. But as we find so often in the teaching of Jesus, priorities seem to be turned upside down. Martha's indignation is not simply a sign of peevishness. She is concerned with service. (The word used is diakonia, a word that had ministerial connotations in the early Christian community). Jesus insists that there is something even more important than hospitality, or any other form of service. It is commitment to him. In no way does Jesus imply that diakonia is unimportant. It is good, but attending to him is "the better part".
