## Winners and Losers



Woop Woop made the grand final against all odds. A bush team they were, with few resources, just a bunch of no name players with average skills but with great hearts. They were up against the City Slickers – a team of professionals with competent coaches and bottomless financial resources. Everybody said it was a mismatch. The coach was concerned. How to win? What to do? He had a bright idea. He persuaded one of the game’s greatest players to address his team. His brief was to tell this bush team how to win. The ex-champ was equal to task. He gave a stirring address. He told them that everyone else thought them unworthy to be finalists, but he didn’t. He considered that they had the game in the bag. They had a great advantage: they had nothing to lose and everything to gain. Their opponents, on the other had, had become smug and secure. They were soft. Life in the bush had made Woop Woop hard and determined. They wanted success more than the City Slickers. He told them, “You will win. They will lose.” This highly imaginative scenario illuminates the message of today’s Gospel. The greatest life coach ever, Jesus Christ, advises his disciples how to belong to God’s Kingdom. By and large, these disciples are without human resources. They are the materially poor, the devout, and the humble. But, they are people who listen to his word and put it into practice. They are willing to follow the coach’s directions. Jesus calls them “blessed” – the winners in the life to come. On the other hand, Jesus recognises another group. Generally, they are comfortable. They have ready access to the good things of life. It gives them a false security. They imagine that present abundance equates with true happiness. They neglect to respond to Jesus. Jesus pronounces woe upon them. Their future will be ridden with misery. In terms of the life to come, they are the losers. Christ’s teaching on the beatitudes and the woes emphasises an important spiritual truth: there is a great disparity between the conditions of this age and the conditions of the age to come. So, if we wish to enter eternal life, we need to begin to adapt to its conditions. This means abandoning our attachments to material things and to imitate more closely a generous God. We open our hearts to the unfortunate and live without expectation of any return. When Jesus blesses the poor and the downtrodden, he does not idealise or glorify poverty. He does, however, declare God’s special commitment to the poor. Gustavo Gutierrez, an eminent third world theologian, offers this insight, “God has a preferential love for the poor not because they are necessarily better than others, morally or religiously, but simply because they are poor and living in an inhuman situation that is contrary to God’s will.” God loves and blesses the poor. To be blessed by God, we too must develop a love for the poor and divest ourselves from attachments to material things.

The word and ritual of the day call us to turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel. In the season of Lent we are invited by God to raise our awareness of sin in our lives, allowing the spirit to create a desire to know God who is full of compassion, slow to anger and rich in graciousness.

Our Lenten observance prepares us for the renewal of our baptismal commitment at Easter. We have a duty and obligation through our baptismal covenant to renew our desire to be witnesses to the good news of God's love revealed in Jesus Christ.
