Confronting Our Demons

For us, the term “wilderness” has a positive meaning. It suggests an experience of pristine landscapes untouched by the destructive hand of human progress. For us, the “wilderness” is not a place that engenders fear and apprehension. Apart from encountering the occasional militant Greenie chained to a tree, we are not likely to run across anything that might harm us or lead us astray.

This, however, is a uniquely modern perspective, which was not shared by those who lived in the first century as with the story of Jesus’ temptation “in the wilderness” recorded in Mark’s Gospel. For people in the first century the wilderness was a forbidding place. For them it was inhabited by demons, evil spirits and wild beasts. For the unwary, it was the region of peril and menace, both physical and psychological. Demons could lead the incautious over a precipice, entangle the careless in brambles, or capture the short-sighted in labyrinthine valleys where physical strength and food supplies would soon peter out. Those thus stranded could be devoured by mythical monsters-or fall prey to bandits.

Anyone who ventured alone into the lonely expanse of the desert, the dark recesses of the forest or into the barren lands of the freezing mountains had to be either crazy or bent on facing-and finding themselves. Either way, the wilderness was where you had to wrestle with your demons.

In this respect, the story of Jesus being tempted by Satan is of great importance. In most Christian liturgical traditions, this story is recalled as we enter into the forty-day period of “Lenten” reflection and repentance. As we embark on our Lenten reflections, we do well to ponder this account of Jesus’ battle with Satan in the wilderness. Although all three Synoptic Gospels recall this story, the Markan evangelist tells us little about what happened when Jesus did encounter Satan. Mark tells us simply that “immediately after Jesus’ baptism “the Spirit drove him out into the wilderness, and he remained there for forty days, tempted by Satan...among the wild beasts, and ministered to by angels” (Mk 1:12-13).

Mark reminds us that “wilderness” is not simply a place of untouched magnificence. It is also a place of silence where the “stilling of the storms” of everyday life opens the door to what we usually repress, our inner demons. All of us have demons to exorcise: obsessions, inhibitions, destructive addictions-or simply bad habits that have possessed us during the passing of the years, and have led us to seek only to feed our own selfish desires. All of us are to varying degrees held captive under the sway of unreasonable fears and formless anxieties born of past hurts, which express themselves in our all-too-willing acceptance of fate.

These are our modern demons, which cannot be simply avoided by crowding them out of our lives. Through the example of Jesus’ struggle we learn that such “demons” must be confronted and can only be exorcised by “prayer and fasting” (cf. Mk 9:29).
