## D.I.Y in Lent

“D.I.Y.” is an expression widely used in our part of the world. It stands of course for “Do It Yourself”. In our culture, if a job around the house can be done by us, then there is no need to call in skilled (and costly) trade’s people. At times the expertise of such folk is necessary, but for most of us the attitude to life is that if there is a job that is within our range of skills, then “D.I.Y” is the way to go. I am sure that the expression “D.I.Y.” would be quite unknown to the officials in the Church who in Rome draw up many of the prescriptions by which we live our Catholic lives. But in the last few decades they have in fact more or less adopted that policy. Older folk will remember when it was prescribed that we not eat meat on Friday. Then the rule was changed. Friday remained a day of penance. But we were now told to decide for ourselves what penitential action we should do on that day. Why the changed rule? In many parts of the world, the faithful are lucky if they eat meat once a week. While going without meat on Friday could be a true penance for Australians and New Zealanders, it was meaningless for vast numbers of other believers. One detailed rule for the whole Church simply did not work. Whereas a self-selected penitential action of one sort or another every Friday, was within the scope of every member of the church policy. Hopefully we regularly remember to replace Friday abstinence from meat with a self-selected act of penance. Whatever of Friday as a weekly day of penance, this Sunday a new D.I.Y. challenge is upon us. This is the challenge of Lent. P.P.C. are the key letters for what D.I.Y. calls us to do in Lent. They stand for Prayer, Penance and Charity. Lent has always been for the most part a D.I.Y. operation. Let us plan now for a well spent Lent. “P” is for prayer. There are manifold choices available to us as to what special to do. It might be a visit to the Blessed Sacrament several times in the week on the way home from work or the supermarket. It could be a daily reading of Scripture. Or it might be reciting daily one or other of the multitude of litanies and other Catholic prayers we could track down using Google or Yahoo. The point is that we have to choose and commit to a course of action. “P” is for penance. The Church sets the pattern of penance by fast and abstinence on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. But for the rest of Lent, penance is very much D.I.Y. Let us rise to the challenge and settle on what to do. “C” for Charity. This is a special time of giving. Not just a “oncer,” a single donation of Easter, but a season of giving., spread out over a series of weeks. Our official Catholic weekly Lenten charity collection sets the tone. But donations to other good causes, including those outside our own Church, are truly part of our Lenten “C”. The letters “P.P.C.” are helpful reminders for planning a fruitful Lent. They fit well with our Australasian D.I.Y. culture.
