We are God's Work of Art

By far the most popular of all Salvador Dali's religious works of art is his Christ of St John of the Cross. Inspired by a drawing done by St John of the Cross himself, it depicts Christ on the cross, hanging over the Bay in Dali's home town, Port Lligat. The artist speaks of having had a 'cosmic dream' which led him to see the nucleus of an atom as 'the very unity of the universe', in other words 'the Christ'.

Like all great artists, Dali's works draw forth a range of emotions from those who view them; he appeals to some and not to others. I would suggest that this remarkable painting, over which Dali agonised, convinced that he would never have been able to repeat it if an accident had spoiled it, would appeal to most of us because it leads us to meditate on that great mystery and paradox-the triumph of the Cross.

Saint John uses the strange episode in the Old Testament, when Moses lifted up a bronze serpent in the desert to save all those who had been bitten by poisonous snakes. It was symbolic of Christ, for he was lifted up on the cross as a focus for us who are seeking healing from the poison of sin.

It is only by looking at the cross that we can get our lives and indeed the whole order of creation into true perspective. It is to see Christ at the heart of the universe, uniting all things in himself. Teilhard de Chardin, the great Jesuit priest, scientist, poet and mystic of the last century, had a similar cosmic vision which inspired his remarkable insights into the mystery of Christ and the whole created order.

Today is traditionally called 'Laetare Sunday', or 'Rejoice Sunday', because of the opening words of the entrance antiphon. It is a day when we are invited to take a breather in the middle of Lent. We are invited to allow ourselves to be lifted out of the humdrum day to day struggle towards the vision of Easter and the Resurrection-so to find in Christ's rising from the dead, our ultimate destiny, and the whole of creation.

So, in the midst of all the struggles to cope with our own personal weaknesses as well as the troubles of the world around us, it might be worth noting another remarkable artistic insight.

St Paul tells us that "we are God's work of art". Most of us struggle with our self-image and would probably be mildly amused at the idea that we might be suitable subjects for great artists to paint.

But of course that is precisely the point at which Paul wants to challenge us. We are not to be weighed down by our sins and failures. We do not have it in our power to resolve all our problems.

But once we can understand that it was out of God's generosity that Christ was sent to save us, then we indeed become subjects for the greatest artist of them all and it would be an insult to God to think otherwise.
