The courage to be

Today's gospel presents us with a most profound and inspirational image of Jesus. We are familiar with the many roles of Jesus as preacher, teacher and healer, but in this reading from the Gospel of John, we are offered a deeper insight into the qualities and attributes Jesus brings to these roles. We know that actions speak louder than words. In this critical situation, it was both Jesus' words and actions that saved this accused woman from stoning. It is interesting that this particular passage was a late insertion into the gospel, and that the event it described is not included in the synoptic gospels. It is as if a particular and specific aspect of Jesus' compassion and actions needed to be made known and emphasized.

The laws during these times required that this woman's adulterous actions be punishable by stoning. The Jewish authorities, knowing this law, were interested to see how Jesus would react when they brought the adulterous woman to him. We can imagine the scene. Jesus is there sitting on the steps of the temple teaching. It is dry, probably hot, and the ground beneath them is arid and dusty. He is surrounded by a group of listeners sitting in the shade as they take in what Jesus is saying and explaining. The calm atmosphere of communication is suddenly shattered. A shamed woman is roughly thrust into the company by a group of accusers whose obvious intention is to trap Jesus in a nasty situation. How will he react? Either way, he is bound to incriminate himself. Jesus' response was in direct contrast to that of his accusers. Where they were challenging and accusing, he was calm and nonjudgmental. He was silent, bending down, and writing on the ground. What he wrote we do not know, but he did not immediately speak or answer their accusations, despite their ongoing insistent questions. Then, Jesus straightened up and turned their accusations and demand for punishment back on them. He does not refer to the woman's sinfulness, but rather, focuses on her accusers: "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." And again he becomes silent, bends down and writes on the ground. No fuss, no defensiveness, no accusations. One by one, they turn and go away. Jesus is left alone with the woman standing before him. "Neither do I condemn you. Go your way, and from now on do not sin again." If only we could all learn from this image of Jesus. Throughout our lives we are challenged and provoked on so many issues: within our families and homes at our workplaces, on sports fields, in traffic, in the supermarket queues, and so on. We do not need to take the high ground. We are often, perhaps too often, quick to jump to conclusions. We react by provoking and wanting to punish. Instead of staying calm and open-minded-to say nothing of keeping a sense of humour and forgiveness, we make the situation worse. How can we be more generous, forgiving and life-affirming?
