Waiting/Preparing

We spend so much of our lives waiting; waiting for the kettle to boil, waiting for the kick-off, waiting for our holidays, waiting for that phone call, waiting for the plane or the train, waiting....waiting...waiting... There is always a certain tension associated with waiting. Some of us quickly become impatient, especially when things are running late. Others were more philosophical and view life with greater equanimity. Some of this we may be able to attribute to our different personalities, but it is not simply a matter of temperament. We can cultivate a right attitude which draws forth the right responses. Advent is the season of waiting. It is also the time when the Church encourages us to cultivate the right responses. Here too there is tension: the tension between how much to rejoice in what has already been accomplished and how much to be preparing for the future. Rightly we will celebrate Christmas because the first advent of the saviour was his birth as a little child in a stable in Bethlehem. In that coming we believe that God restored the link between heaven and earth, healing our broken human nature. But healed and restored as we are, we know we are still damaged, constantly in need of further healing and forgiveness, waiting now for the second coming of the Lord. In Peter's words we are still waiting for the fulfilment of the Lord's promise: "the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home." It is a delicate balance: learning to live with the tension, knowing when to relax and rejoice, when to prepare and work for what lies ahead. The season of Advent perfectly sums up our human condition.

In his letter to the Philippians St Paul gives us his own take on all this. He acknowledges that he has stopped striving for perfection by his own efforts, noting that perfection comes through faith in Christ. So he concludes: "All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus." Be thankful that you know Christ and seek to deepen your faith in all that he would do for you. At the same time look for opportunities to smooth the way for him to enter more and more into your life. Be imaginative: see what would really make a difference. Giving more time to prayer is an obvious example. It might be helpful to see if there is a prayer group you could join or a new method of prayer that you could try. I suggest we learn to enjoy the tension of this Advent and use it well-rejoicing in what we have already achieved and learning to cope with the uncertainty and the waiting. A good example is given by those who, when faced with a plane or train which is late, do not fret or become angry, but us the time calmly and to good effect. With the uncertainty that comes from waiting we live in hope, the sure knowledge that the Lord fulfils his promises.
